- ◆ Choose a toy e.g. a doll or train set. Compare how the toy has changed since Victorian times. Is it still made of the same materials? Do the same age children still play with it?

- Can you make a sock or glove puppet?
- Can you make a room and furniture for a doll's house?
- Play a range of board games to get some ideas. Can you design your own board game and counters? What are the rules?
- Use your toys to act out a story you know well. Can you take photographs and write a caption for each photograph?
