

## WWI Assembly A Tribute To A Decorated Soldier

Wyn Williams is always a firm favourite when he visits the school for assemblies. This week he visited Year 6 when he outlined the experiences of William Coltman, the most decorated British non-commissioned officer in WW1. He told the children what William did to be awarded the honours, despite never firing a shot, and what life was like in that war. He also detailed why he did what he did because he was a Christian. The children, who have been studying the WWII conflict, then got ask questions about this remarkable man. The presentation is very personal to Mr Williams, as William Coltman was the grandfather of a friend of his.
