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









Dear Parent/Carers,

# **Irchester - Archeological Dig**







The children of Years 4 and 5, travelled to Irchester House in Wellingborough, where they had the opportunity to engage with the live excavation of an ancient Roman Town. In addition to a tour of the excavation, the children were guided by staff from ULAS (University of Leicester Archaeology Services) through some of the jobs of an archaeologist, including object identification and finds washing. With both Year Groups having previously studied the Romans, this experience was a fantastic opportunity to retrieve previous learning and find out first-hand how archaeological digs help us discover secrets of the past.
