

Look at some Landmarks:

(3 points each)

- ◆ Use pencil/ charcoal to create a piece of artwork based on a European landmark or key place to visit. e.g. Warwick Castle, Eiffel Tower, Big Ben.
- ◆ Create a pictorial map of London showing the key features e.g. River Thames, Big Ben London Eye, Trafalgar Square.

City Guide (2 points each)

- ◆ Research different European cities. Find out some interesting facts.
- ◆ Create a guide for Visitors who are new to the city. For example- a guide to Paris

Explore your mathematical skills:

(2 points each)

- ◆ Calculate the distances between your home town and different capital cities in Europe. Compare distances on a chart or graph. Which is the nearest/furthest city?
- ◆ Research exchange rates for the pound and the euro. Create a simple conversion chart. Take five shopping items; calculate the cost in euros.
- ◆ Research a place of interest (e.g. Buckingham Palace) and analyse the costings to take a family of 5 to visit for the day. Include: Entrance, meals and drinks (and anything else that may be of interest).
