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




A Message from Mrs Yuen...

Topic Investigations

As part of Year 4's topic Burps, Bottoms and Bile, they are looking at the digestive system. This week they have investigated the digestive system of various animals including cows and owls. They discovered that owls are unable to digest the bones and fur of the animals they eat. Year 4 worked in small groups and dissected some owl pellets taking great care so they could use the bones to identify the animal's owl had eaten. They found it fascinating and discovered the owls had eaten a shrew, a vole and a bird.
